

There are several ways to view your flight data from the Mercury altimeter. Choose the method that best suits your setup or particular moment.

We think it's easiest to manage via the Altimeter Cloud with your Mercury connected to the internet via WiFi.

However there are plenty of reasons for example in the field or flying without internet access that you might want to use the other options too.

Via the Altimeter Cloud

The easiest and most detailed way to view your flights. Charts, statistics, and full sensor data are available on the Altimeter Cloud website. Your Mercury uploads over WiFi.

>

Via the device's AP WiFi

Connect directly to the Mercury's built-in WiFi access point and view flight summaries on its internal web server. No internet required — useful in the field or at the launch site.

>

Summary via USB serial

Connect the Mercury to a PC or phone via USB and read a text summary of your last flight over the serial connection. A quick way to check your logbook without WiFi.

>

SnapShot screen

Connect a SnapShot add-on display to your Mercury and view your last flight summary on a small screen. No phone, laptop, or WiFi needed. Simply plug it in and read.
